According to me, I feel 5 identities for whom getting a safe abortion will be easier are upper caste people, upper class, middle class urban individuals, cis gendered heterosexual people, and married people.

The rationale behind upper caste is that the uc individuals have a privilege over lower caste or marginalized communities. They do hold power and therefore it is not very difficult to get an abortion.

Upper class and middle class and specifically people who are in urban setting, for them there are more facilities and services available in the city itself which provide them safe access to abortion, and lesser stigma as compared to a traditional setting. Higher classes again can think of spending more money on abortion but the lower class or someone who can't afford will find it very difficult to get an abortion.

Cis gendered heterosexual women or people will find it comparatively easier to get an abortion since they don't have to face other kinds of oppression or violence that people who are not cis gendered or heterosexual face. The clinics can be very unwelcoming and insensitive to them.

The married couples will find it easier to get an abortion because they won't be judged by the doctors or other members of the clinic because of our heteronormative brahmanical structure which puts marriage as something that is a necessary condition to establish a sexual relationship or procreate. Unmarried or single individuals face judgements, remarks and often find it difficult to access abortion.
